May 14 – 15, 2024 | n=604 | ±3.97%



Insights & Analysis

- For the first time in the last five years, voters are more likely to view the state as headed down the wrong track (47%), a 13-point negative swing since January 2023.
 - More than half of voters now hold a negative view on the direction of public education in Colorado; +5 since January.
- More than two-thirds of voters would rather see state spending cut than have an increase in taxes, including a majority of Democrats (52%) and urban voters (59%).
- Half of voters believe public school is the best option for their child or grandchild, 20-points more than private school.
 - Only Republicans are more likely to prefer private school over public school.
 - Support for public schools wanes among rural voters and voters without college degrees.
 - Suburban voters are more likely than urban or rural voters to prefer public schools.
- Voters are split on how much authority parents should have on curriculum with a weak plurality (40%) preferring that parents have a lot of say in the classroom.
 - Women are more dispersed in their opinions compared to men; where most men over 50 prefer a lot of say and a plurality of younger men think some say is appropriate.
- Government spending and taxes has become the distinguished top priority (19%) with a more than 6-point increase since January and all other issues have dropped in importance.



Insights & Analysis

- Jared Polis's image (48% fav, 46% unfav; 6% NO/NHO) has been decimated since January 2023 with a 13-point decrease in favorability, going from +26 to +2 overall.
 - Similarly, images for Democrats have worsened across the board with Biden's net favorability down to -17.
- A majority (50%) voted for Biden (+13) in 2020, and it's clear RFK is siphoning votes more from Biden than Trump on the 2024 ballot where Biden fails to reach a majority and his lead has shrunk to +6.
